PROCEDURES FOR IDENTIFYING LEP STUDENTS

- 1. A *Home Language Survey* is completed by ALL new students enrolling in the Amherst Exempted Village Schools. This survey is included on the back of the registration packet.
- 2. IF the *Home Language Survey* indicates a language other than English is spoken at home, that student is assessed in his/her ability to read, write, speak, listen and comprehend in English within the first four weeks of enrollment. The assessment tool used is the Idea Proficiency Test (IPT).
- 3. If a student is LEP, the school determines which kind of language program will address the student's English language and academic needs. The program designed and implemented is based on scientific research.
- 4. The schools must review LEP students plans by SEPTEMBER 15th each year.
- 5. Schools determine if a LEP student is eligible for additional accommodations on statewide proficiency/achievement assessments, according to state law. State law allows the following accommodations: scribe for reading, writing, and listening, read aloud for reading and writing, large print, and Braille.
- 6. Schools annually re-assess LEP students' English language proficiency using the state OTELA assessment.
- 7. Data must be recorded in EMIS. Please refer to the EMIS Data Form for LEP
