

The student must register with the NCAA Eligibility Center (HYPERLINK "<http://eligibilitycenter.org>"<http://eligibilitycenter.org>). This should be done preferably in your junior year of high school.

Eligibility is based on a sliding scale that combines the core class GPA and the sum of standardized test scores.

2. During your high school career, you must pass 16 core-course units in the following distributions:

4 units of English

3 units of Math

2 units of Science (one must have a lab)

2 units of Social Studies

4 additional units in any of the approved areas.

The grades in these courses are used to calculate the student's core GPA.

\*Core Courses completed in 8th grade may be used IF they appear on the high school transcript.

\*Core Courses must be completed within 4 years from the start of 9th grade.

3. Submit ACT/SAT scores directly to the Clearinghouse using the 9999 code when you register. Test scores are "summed". The SAT total score is the sum of the Critical Reading and Math components. The ACT sum score is the total of the English, Math, Reading, and Science sub-scores.

**PLEASE NOTE:**

There are different requirements for Division II, III, and NAIA schools. Check the NCAA Clearinghouse website for each.
